Felicia Lawrence – Born and raised on the South Side of Chicago, she graduated from Morgan Park High School and went on to earn her degree in Journalism and Mass Communications from North Carolina A&T State University. She most recently served as an anchor/reporter at the FOX affiliate in Charlotte. As a former intern at The U, "The Jam" marks Felicia's return to the station and the city.

Danielle Robay – Danielle is returning to her hometown of Chicago after spending years in Los Angeles interviewing the biggest names in Hollywood and building a loyal social media following.
